Race Report

No, not cosmetic surgery in Turkey, but a description of the close racing at Cullaun on Thursday evening. For a fleet of 14 boats on the water, in a pleasant steady south-westerly breeze, the course was set with precision by Jane Collins who assisted the OOD Michael Collins.

The first race started with a fleet closely bunched, the highlight of which was an amazing U-turn by Kevin Mulcahy, of which any politician would have been proud.

Line honours went to Margaret Hynes and Mike Hayes, closely pursued by Robert Stafford and Laura Collins, and Kevin Mulcahy and Martin Golden.

Race 2 was lengthened with the addition of an extra triangle. There was a sausage in each race.

The highlight of Race 2 occurred at the windward mark. Picture the scene: Kevin Mulcahy on the right side of the beat on a starboard tack. Laura Collins and Robert Stafford on the left side of the beat approach the mark on port. Despite much shouting of “starboard”, Laura and Robert went for the gap, nipped in, and tucked away the lead which they retained to the end. Impressive sailing by Ingrid Biesty and Ruth Golden saw them finish a very creditable 4th in both races.
